


FINDING AN ARTICLE FROM A CITATION

Sample citation:

Exposing the true nature of chocolate. Michael Lipske. *National Wildlife* 41.3 (April-May 2003): p18(2).

First, look in the Electronic Journal collection

The Library provides access to some journals electronically. **Go to the *Articles, Books, Journals, etc.*** link on the library homepage (lib.nmsu.edu), scroll down to the middle of the page (below where the databases are listed) then search by the name of the journal (not the title of the article title).



Search for keywords in e-journals

The links from the Full Text Electronic Journals page could take you to several different ways of accessing the title electronically. Some just link to the database containing the full-text of the journal. Others pull up all articles from the journal within the database. Yet others pull up a listing of each issue of the journal within the database.

Because not all journals are available electronically, go to the NMSU Library catalog to search for journals that do not have full-text online through the databases or the Electronic Journals link (such as this example).

Looking in the Library Catalog

To check the library catalog, click on the **NMSU Libraries Catalog** (libcat.nmsu.edu) link, then search by Journal Title. Again, be sure to use the title of the journal, not the title of the article.

You need to look at individual entries to see what exactly the Library owns and where it is located. Generally only the current, unbound issues are in the Current Periodicals Reading Room in Branson. Older journal issues may be bound and filed with the books upstairs, or replaced by microfiche or microfilm format. *All formats will use the same call number for the journal.*

What to do if you can't find it

After checking the library catalog AND the electronic journals links, if you can't find the journal listed in your citation, use the Request It! (aka Interlibrary Loan) service to obtain a copy of the article.
