



Full-Text Databases

A full-text database is one that provides the entire article (not just a brief description of it) for many or all of the articles it includes. Most full-text database include articles that are NOT full-text, too.

Full-text databases contain articles that are also found in print sources; their contents are not the same as those found by Web search engines such as Google. So, when your instructor tells you not to use the Web to find information, full-text databases are acceptable sources.

All the databases listed below can be accessed from the Library's Article Database page (<http://lib.nmsu.edu/article.shtml>). When using any of these databases from off-campus, you will need to validate into the database by entering your social security number (without spaces or hyphens).

GENERAL DATABASES (includes information on multiple subjects)

InfoTrac Expanded Academic ASAP, <http://lib.nmsu.edu/resources/dbexpacd.html>

Full-text articles, abstracts and citations from several thousand academic journals, general periodicals, magazines and newspapers.

General Reference Center, <http://lib.nmsu.edu/resources/dbgenref.html>

Full-text articles, abstracts and citations in periodicals, newspapers, and reference books covering general interest, business, humanities, social sciences, children's topics, and current event information, with coverage as far back as 1980.

Lexis-Nexis Academic Universe, <http://lib.nmsu.edu/resources/dblexis.html>

Full-text access to current news, business, legal, and reference information.

Statistical Universe, <http://lib.nmsu.edu/resources/dblexis.html>

Statistical information from hundreds of major federal, state and international sources are searchable by subject, agency, and SuDoc number. View and download tables and charts in a variety of convenient formats. Produced by the Congressional Information Service.

Wilson Select Plus, <http://lib.nmsu.edu/resources/dbwilson.html>

Full text journal database with over 800 high-quality periodicals. Comprised of records from Readers' Guide Abstracts, Social Sciences Abstracts, Humanities Abstracts, General Science Abstracts, and Wilson Business Abstracts. 1994 -present; available via FirstSearch.

Offers a fundamental reference source for students, library patrons, library reference staff, and scholars alike. Includes biographies, encyclopedia entries, facts, statistics. Available via FirstSearch.

Search 1000 premier worldwide business periodicals for information on advertising, marketing, economics, human resources, finance, taxation, computers, and more. Also, information on 60,000+ companies.

CIAO (Columbia International Affairs Online), <http://lib.nmsu.edu/resources/dbciao.html>

A comprehensive source for theory and research in international affairs. It publishes a wide range of scholarship from 1991 onward that includes working papers from university research institutes, occasional papers series from NGOs, foundation-funded research projects, proceedings from conferences, books, journals and policy briefs.

Access the full text of congressional reports, documents, prints, bills and the Congressional Record. CU also contains the Federal Register, Code of Federal Regulations, voting records and committee reports and key publications related to American public policy. Produced by the Congressional Information Service.

Disclosure Corporate Snapshots, <http://lib.nmsu.edu/resources/dbdiscl.html>

Contains information about all public company filings including annual reports, company summary information, and shareholder reports. Includes information from public documents maintained by the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. Offers daily updates of stock trading reports. Displays full text of documents. 1986-present; available via FirstSearch.

Provides comprehensive access to a full range of environmental concerns, from local to worldwide conditions. Coverage includes journals, conference papers and proceedings.

Archive of scholarly journals. JSTOR does not include issues from recent volumes, usually the last 2 to 5 years.

Full-text articles on Latin American news, economics, politics; 1986--present.

Full-text statistics, business and trade information produced by the U.S. government.
